On the U.S. front, Emily supports efforts to ensure that USAID, the State Department, and the White House prioritize and promote a holistic vision of gender equality.

frequently among the most marginalized in efforts to prevent or resolve conflict. Young men are regularly depicted as the perpetrators of violence and young women are portrayed as victims. This narrative severely discounts the important role young people play in building peace. Research shows that peace processes are more successful when they are inclusive and in many conflict-ridden societies youth account for a large percentage of the population, making their participation all the more vital. A new United

Nations Security Council resolution passed in July aims to enshrine the critical role of youth in building peace.


