This multidisciplinary course looks through the lens of Social Movement Theory to evaluate the meanings and manifestations of Islamic activism in global context. We highlight regional variations of gender-based Islamic activism to determine its broad characteristics and evaluate particular cases of Islamic social movements in six countries, arranged thematically: Bangladesh (NGOs & Development); Egypt (Feminism and Political Mobilization); Indonesia (Grassroots Activism); Morocco (Legal Reform), Kuwait (Women and Corporate Social Responsibility/CSR), and Turkey (Socio-political Mobilization). This seminar course is open to upper-level undergraduates and graduate students with previous study or knowledge of Islam and/or Muslimmajority societies.



The Gendered Dynamics of Gun Violence in Chicago

"In October 2020, Chicago was headed toward an increase of at least 51 percent in the murder rate and a 52 percent increase in shootings by the end of the year, compared to 2019. The city's advocates and social service providers projected that COVID-19 will also increase domestic violence,

"We argue that understanding the gendered dynamic of conflict helps us better understand increasing rates of violence and ways to mitigate it. A review of the data reveals that gun violence in the city is highly correlated to domestic violence, including sexual and gender-based violence (SGBV). Areas with increased rates of domestic violence also experience higher


